Detailed Reports and Photographs of Programmes Conducted Self Defence Session by Women Cell

1. The Women Cell at KAHM Unity College, in collaboration with 24 News Channel, organized a self-defence session on December 8th to mark Channel's 5th Anniversary. This event marked the inauguration of Women Empowerment programs that will be conducted throughout Kerala this year. Mr. Meharali NM, Additional District Magistrate of Malappuram, inaugurated the event, and students actively participated in self-defence practice during the session. Dr. Faseela coordinated the event.







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2. Life Skill Training

09-02-2024: conducted a life skill training session for the wellness club members on 9th February 2024. The session handled by Mrs Muheena Thasneem, Jeevani counsellor of the college.







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3. Personality Development

20-03-2024: The personality development session held on March 20, 2024, was a significant event organized by the Wellness Club in collaboration with the Department of Psychology. The session aimed to enhance personal growth, self-awareness, and interpersonal skills among students. The session handled by Mr Abdul Raoof, consultant psychologist -wellness Clinic Manjeri. The session began with an overview of personality development, emphasizing its importance in personal and professional life. The resource person highlighted various aspects of personality, including traits, attitudes, and behaviour.





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4. Journey through the Heart of india

In Delhi, the group marveled at historic sites like the Red Fort, Jama Masjid, and India Gate. In Agra, the Taj Mahal and Agra Fort captivated them with Mughal grandeur. Manali's snow-capped mountains and adventure sports in Rohtang Pass and Solang Valley provided a refreshing retreat. In Kullu, the scenic beauty of the Great Himalayan National Park and cultural sites like Naggar Castle and Hadimba Devi Temple enriched the experience.





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5. EmoShift: Mastering Emotional Regulation

The session titled "EmoShift: Mastering Emotional Regulation" was conducted on November 28, 2023t for college students. Thirty students participated in the session. The purpose of the session was to provide attendees with practical strategies and insights to enhance their emotional regulation skills, ultimately fostering greater emotional well-being and resilience. The session commenced with self introducing each other which creates a comfortable and engaging atmosphere. Attendees were encouraged to share their experiences and perspectives on emotional regulation, laying the groundwork for a collaborative and inclusive learning environment. The session focused on developing emotional awareness as a foundational skill for effective regulation. Attendees learned techniques for identifying and labeling their







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emotions, as well as understanding the underlying triggers and patterns. A variety of practical strategies and techniques for regulating emotions were introduced and demonstrated. These included mindfulness practices, deep breathing exercises, cognitive restructuring, and positive coping mechanisms such as journaling and creative expression.



6. Two-day Nature Camp & Brahmagiri Peak Hiking

The Eco & Nature Club organized a two-day nature education camp and Brahmagiri peak trekking event at Thirunelli forest division in Wayanad on January 13th and 14th, 2024. On the inaugural day, participants immersed themselves in the wonders of nature with a visit to the Kalindhi River and an insightful nature class and a documentary by renowned wildlife expert Mr. Muneer Tholpetty, focusing on the majestic elephants that inhabit the region. Day two kicked off with an early morning bird-watching session led by Mr. Nandu, the Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) of Thirunelli Forest Division. The pinnacle of the event was the Brahmagiri peak trek, a challenging 12-kilometer journey guided by





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dedicated forest guards. The trek concluded at the breathtaking peak at 1608 meters above sea level, providing participants with a sense of accomplishment and stunning panoramic views of the border between Kudak and Wayanad.





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7. ILU Foundation Event






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17. Insights a Peek into the World of Blindness

21.Anti-dowry Campaign

Under the initiative of the Women Cell of the college, the students took part in the Anti-dowry Campaign on 28th November 2022. As a part of creating awareness against the evil practice of dowry, the students took an oath that they would neither offer nor accept dowry.







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The objective of an anti-dowry pledge is to combat the social practice of dowry, which is the giving of gifts, property, or money from the bride's family to the groom's family at the time of marriage. Dowry practices can lead to financial burdens, exploitation, and various forms of abuse against women and their families. By taking an anti-dowry pledge, individuals commit to refusing and discouraging the acceptance or exchange of dowry during marriages.

The primary objectives of an anti-dowry pledge are:

Promoting gender equality: Dowry practices reinforce traditional gender roles and contribute to the subordination of women. By rejecting dowry, the pledge aims to promote equal treatment and respect for women in marriage.

Empowering women: The pledge encourages women and their families to stand against the pressure to give dowry, empowering them to assert their rights and maintain their dignity.

Combating financial exploitation: Dowry demands can place a significant financial burden on the bride's family, leading to economic hardship and debt. The pledge aims to alleviate the financial strain on families and prevent exploitation.

Raising awareness: Taking the pledge helps raise awareness about the negative impacts of dowry and promotes discussions around gender-based discrimination and violence.

Challenging societal norms: The pledge challenges deeply entrenched societal norms and expectations related to dowry, encouraging individuals to question and reject these practices.

The expected outcomes of an anti-dowry pledge include:

Reduction in dowry-related violence: By refusing to accept or demand dowry, the pledge contributes to reducing instances of domestic violence, harassment, and abuse that may occur when dowry expectations are not met.

Economic empowerment: Families are relieved from the financial burden of dowry, allowing them to invest their resources in education, healthcare, and other productive activities. This contributes to the overall empowerment of women and their families.



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Change in societal attitudes: Taking the pledge can influence wider societal attitudes towards dowry, challenging the social acceptance of this practice and encouraging a more egalitarian view of marriage.

Enhanced legal protection: Anti-dowry pledges can create awareness about existing legal protections against dowry and support efforts to enforce laws that criminalize dowry-related offenses.

Promotion of alternative marriage practices: The pledge encourages individuals to explore alternative marriage practices that prioritize love, respect, and equal partnership rather than material exchange.


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32. Mountain Trekking Program
