The college has organized placement drives, mock tests for competitive exams like CAT, sessions on career and research opportunities, ABACUS training, and

15-day on-the-job training programmes. These efforts are aimed at ensuring that students are equipped with the practical skills and confidence needed to succeed in the job market. By emphasizing employability, the institution contributes to the economic independence of its graduates, enabling them to support themselves and their families and contribute positively to their communities

3. **Entrepreneurship**: Institution invests heavily in fostering an entrepreneurial spirit among its students. Through the entrepreneurship development club and alumni association, the institution offers various programmes that encourage students to explore new business opportunities and develop innovative solutions. The college has organized workshops on wooden mural art, entrepreneurship awareness programmes, mushroom cultivation, paper and bag-making workshops, certificate course on ornamentation, doll-

making, and a diet clinic. These initiatives not only enhance students' entrepreneurial skills but also enable them to become job creators rather than job seekers. By empowering students to pursue entrepreneurial ventures, the institution helps them realize their potential as innovators and contributors to economic growth.

4. **Empowerment**: Education at Unity Women's College goes beyond academics to focus on holistic empowerment. The institution aims to empower students to become better decision-makers within their families, communities, and professional lives. Empowerment initiatives encompass physical fitness, psychological well-being, and health and diet awareness, ensuring a comprehensive approach to personal development.

Gender audit, conducted by IQAC, have provided valuable insights into areas where further efforts are needed to achieve equality and empowerment. The college has organized workshops on personality development, yoga sessions for mental well-being, sessions on gender discrimination, premarital education, traffic awareness campaigns, and listening skills workshops. Additionally, a blog for the Women's Cell has been created to provide a platform for student voices and concerns. These efforts ensure that students are not only empowered in the academic sphere but also in their personal and social lives.

5. **Emancipation:** Many students at the college are first-generation learners, making the role of the institution in their empowerment even more crucial. The efforts towards emancipation include conducting surveys to understand generational dynamics and maternity status among students under

the IQAC.
