The college is offering only one P.G Course with an intake of 12 students, out of which none has qualified the NET examination during the year of report.

Two teachers are under FDP of UGC. Mr.Zakir Ahamed, Head, Dept. of Physical Education and Mrs. Ramlath.K.T., Assistant Professor of Chemistry are deputed to pursue Ph.D. Degree in Bharatiar University and M.Phil. Degree in the University of Calicut respectively. Mrs.P.Jyothi, Assistant Professor of Chemistry and Mrs.Annie Ninan, Assistant Professor of Home Science, have been awarded Ph.D Degree by University of Calicut and deemed University of Avinashilingam, Coimbatore respectively. Four teachers are continuing their doctoral research as part-time scholars. Four teachers attended various orientation and refresher programmes in different disciplines. Nine faculty members participated in seminars and workshops conducted by different institutions.

Process of admission is fully computerized while the administration is partially computerized.

- 26. Increase in infrastructural facilities:
 - * A seminar hall with a seating capacity of two hundred and forty has been constructed.
 - * As a part of improving the teaching-learning process, the institution has purchased 8 more LCD projectors 8 laptop computers and 1 interactive board..
 - * Laboratory facilities have been improved by adding 3 binocular microscopes, 3 electronic balances and 2 computers.
 - * With the aim of computerizing the administration process 4 more computers are installed in the office.
- 27. Technology upgradation:

Systems in the departments are upgraded by installing 1 GB RAM. Computerised the fee collection in connection with conveyance facility, installed inverter system in Academic block.

28. Computer & Internet access and training to teachers and students:

The Network Resource Centre assures Internet access to all the teachers and students. The examination wing in the office and the department of Computer Science are having their own Internet facility. Training in computer and internet usage was offered to the teachers by one of the faculty members of the Computer Science department. Moreover, the students have the provision to select a paper in Computer Science during the V Semester.

29. Financial aid to students.

A total of 438 students are availing financial assistance under different schemes like Government scholarships, Post-metric scholarships, University merit scholarship, Muslim girl's scholarship, scholarship for SC/ST, Student's Aid Fund and fee concessions.

30 Support from Alumni association and its activities:

Being a young women's college, the support from alumni is nominal. Any how steps are taken to convene periodic meetings to strengthen the Alumni.

31. Support from the Parent-Teacher Association and its activities:

The Parent Teacher Association supports the institution in all its efforts to march ahead. The transportation facility to the college is partially supported by the PTA. Inorder to encourage students, PTA distributed cash prizes and certificates to the University Rank Holders and class toppers. The class toppers of the internal examinations were motivated by presenting awards in the form of books. They also contributed financial aid to 21 needy students.

32 Health Services:

Annual medical check-up of the students was carried out. Periodic awareness classes on relevant health problems were also organized.

33. Performance in sports activities:

Our College Badminton Team under Miss.Rajisha.V (III B.Com. Co-operation) became the runners up in the team championship held from $6^{th} - 9^{th}$ Aug. 2010 at the Cosmopolitan Club, Manjeri. Shabna.V (I Sem. B.A English), Khajla Ummer (I Sem. B.Sc. Botany) and Shajna, P (III Sem. B.Sc. Computer Science) were the other members.

The team also represented the college in the Interzonal Inter Collegiate Tournament held at N.S.S College, Ottapalam.
