6.3.1 Curriculum Development

There is active involvement by the faculty members in curriculum re structuring process of the university. The representations in various Boards of studies provide chances for fruitful discussion during the formulation of syllabi.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

As part of improvement of the quality teaching learning process the ICT learning by providing LCD projector, Laptop are distributed to all department. Smart board is introduced to ensure the visual learning. To promote E.Learning departments of History, English host BLOGS.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Training programmes on new methods of evaluation are organized by inviting experts in this field. Faculty members are regularly depute to attend examination board meetings, centralized valuation camps. The college has its own examination wing with Principal as chief superintended. There is continuous evaluation through summative and formative evaluation system.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

There is a research committee which is monitoring all the research related activities. Currently there are four ongoing minor research project. Four of our teachers are recognized guides at approved research centres.

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The college library is functioning on the recommendation of college library advisory committee headed by Principal. There is Network Research Centre attached to the library. Separate reference journal and CD borrowing facility are available. Library is automated by software 'Book Magic'. College is registered with INFLIBNET, N List. Computers available to student in ratio 1/11. It infrastructure is improved by adding new computers and by high speed internet connectivity. The teaching learning facility and other amenities are provided by utilizing funds from government and management agencies.

#### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

The selection and recruitment of teaching and non teaching staff members are done on merit base. The governing body monitors the day – to – day activities of institution as part of channelizing them to serve for the progress of the institution.

#### 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Recruitment of the staff members both permanent and part time category is made purely on the basis of post sanctioned by the government. The selection for filling the post is as per the norms and condition of the government and university rules. The governing body is very keen on the qualification and experience of candidates. The college has tie up with few industrial and financial institutions as part of training and internship programmes.


