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# DEPARTMENT OF BOTANY

## ACTION TAKEN REPORT 2020-21

1. **6th July 2020:** The academic year started with the **inauguration of the Botany Association**, accompanied by a talk on **'Plants as Immunity Boosters'**. This topic was particularly relevant, given the global pandemic, highlighting how plants can play a role in enhancing immunity.
2. **8th August 2020:** A **PHYTOS Series Webinar** was conducted on **"Plant Taxonomy Classification and Identification of Angiosperm families"**. This event focused on plant taxonomy, helping students and participants understand classification and the identification of various angiosperm families.
3. **15th January 2021:** An online talk under the **PHYTOS webinar series** focused on **"Career Options in Life Science"**, guiding students on potential career paths in the life sciences.
4. **27th January 2021:** A webinar titled **"Basic Principles of Intellectual Property Rights"** was organized. This event provided students with an understanding of intellectual property and its importance in the field of science.
5. **9th February 2021:** A **field trip to Thikkodi** was organized for the collection of algae, offering students hands-on experience in algal collection.
6. **23rd February 2021:** A talk on **"Algal Diversity and Its Industrial Uses"** was conducted. This session aimed to educate students about the variety of algae and their potential applications in industry.
7. **27th February 2021:** Another webinar was held on the **"Diversity and Importance of Bryophytes"**, conducted by Manjula. This emphasized the ecological significance of bryophytes.

11. **3rd March 2021:** A second field visit was made to the **Regional Agricultural Research Station in Pattambi**, likely focused on agricultural practices and research.



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# DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY

## ACTION TAKEN REPORT 2020-21
