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
3. Library and literary club (23-24)




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5. Awareness program on n-list and open access resources

Women cell in association with Shihab Thangal library and information centre organized 'awareness program on n-list and open access resources' on 22th march, 2024. Mr. Prasanth m, librarian, department of folklore studies, university of Calicut, spearheaded the session.

The objective of the session was to familiarize participants with the usage of n-list (national library and information services infrastructure for scholarly content) and open access resources, enabling them to effectively utilize these platforms for academic and research purposes.

Navigation techniques within the portal were explained to facilitate efficient resource exploration. The feedback underscored the participants' enthusiasm for the training, which equipped them with practical skills to leverage n-list and open access resources for academic and research pursuits.



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


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6. Add on course scientific history writing

Challenges include limited access to primary sources and technical issues, highlighting the need for additional resources such as digitization, specialized databases, and faculty training in blended learning methods.









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7. Use of ICT tools

Pg and research department of English adopted technology-based teaching methods to enhance engagement and effectiveness in the post-pandemic educational landscape, integrating digital strategies into classroom practices. This approach aims to modernize traditional teaching and increase learner participation and involvement. Technology-enhanced teaching methods, includes google meet, google classroom, and various virtual platforms for synchronous and asynchronous learning. After resuming inperson classes, flipped learning practices and digital resources like recorded sessions and podcasts continued to support and engage students.

8. Weekly Seminar Series

The department of mathematics initiated a weekly online seminar series to promote research and learning among students, encouraging them to explore mathematical topics beyond their coursework. Each Sunday, a student delivers a lecture followed by a q & a session, enhancing research and presentation skills. Success is evidenced by increased student engagement, improved skills, and positive feedback. Challenges included technical issues and scheduling conflicts, with future plans to expand the seminar's reach and offer advanced workshops.






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


How do you rate the session on 21st Century Skills by Mr. Bisher K C?




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22. Pteridophytes - an introduction




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23. Lower plant groups; algae, bryophytes and pteridophytes

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






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
