




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Analysis of Gender Audit Student Survey

The following are the analysis of gender audit survey data from students across various departments at KAHM Unity Women's College, Manjeri

Key areas addressed include:

- 1. Safety on Campus: Most students reported feeling "very safe" or "somewhat safe" on campus, with few reporting any incidents or unsafe experiences.
- 2. College Facilities: Responses varied from "always accessible" to "sometimes accessible," reflecting satisfaction with facilities like hostels and toilets.
- 3. Encouragement and Support: A majority felt encouraged to participate in class and received faculty support, though some noted variability in the availability and quality of teaching materials.
- 4. Participation in Extracurriculars: Involvement in sports and clubs was generally positive but showed some students with minimal engagement.
- 5. Awareness and Access to Services: Awareness of counselling services and emergency protocols varied. There were mixed responses regarding training on gender-based issues.
- 6. Overall Satisfaction: Many students expressed being "very satisfied" with their college experience, while others indicated being "somewhat satisfied" or neutral.

The summary reveals a positive general sentiment towards campus safety, support, and satisfaction, though some areas like facility accessibility and student awareness of services show room for improvement.



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
