Scientific and Ecological Exploration: ICAR-IISR Kozhikode & Kadalundi Bird Sanctuary Visit

As part of the academic curriculum and in an effort to provide practical exposure beyond the classroom, the M.Sc. Second semester students of the Department of Botany undertook an educational visit to ICAR-Indian Institute of Spices Research (IISR), Kozhikode, and the Kadalundi Bird Sanctuary, located in the Kozhikode district of Kerala. The visit to ICAR-IISR, a premier research institute dedicated to spices under the Indian Council of Agricultural Research, offered students valuable insights into advanced research and laboratory techniques. The team explained various molecular tools in the molecular biology lab used in spice crop improvement, including DNA extraction, marker-assisted selection, and genetic diversity studies. Students gained an understanding of how molecular biology supports plant genetics and disease resistance. The second and most significant part of the visit was to the Kadalundi Bird Sanctuary, a biologically rich estuarine ecosystem where the Kadalundi river meets the Arabian Sea. This region is not only a haven for migratory birds but also supports an extensive and ecologically important mangrove forest. Students identified and studied common mangrove species such as Avicennia officinalis, Rhizophora mucronata, Sonneratia alba, and Bruguiera gvmnorrhiza.





Trekking Programme to Unity Hills, Manjeri

To commemorate National Mountain Climbing Day, the P.G. and Research Department of Botany organized an adventurous trekking programme to Unity Hills, Manjeri on 30th July 2025. Both P.G. and U.G. students of the department participated. The programme aimed to foster environmental awareness and a deeper appreciation for biodiversity in natural landscapes. 


Debate On Artificial Intelligence: Threat To Human Employment




Basheer Day Celebration


