PTA Meeting



Department of History

Study Tour

The Department of History organized a mandatory study tour for the fifth-semester B.A. History students (Batch 2023–26) from 7th to 16th October 2025, covering Agra, Jaipur, Jaisalmer, and Delhi as part of their academic enrichment programme. A total of 54 students and 3 faculty members participated in the ten-day educational journey, which aimed to provide firsthand exposure to the historical and cultural heritage of North India. The tour served as a practical extension of their classroom learning, allowing students to explore significant monuments, architectural styles, and cultural practices that have shaped Indian history. The itinerary began with visits to the Taj Mahal and Red Fort in Agra, followed by the Hawa Mahal and Amber Fort in Jaipur. In Jaisalmer, students explored the majestic Jaisalmer Fort and Patwon Ki Haveli, and enjoyed an unforgettable night stay at the Thar Desert, which included a thrilling desert safari. The trip concluded in Delhi, where students visited important historical landmarks such as the Red Fort, Qutub Complex, Indira Gandhi Museum, India Gate, and Jama Masjid.



Study Trip to Wayanad

On 25 October 2025, the Department of History organized a one-day study tour to Wayanad for first-year B.A. History students. The group visited the ancient Thirunelli Temple to explore its unique architecture and historical importance, Edakkal Caves to examine Neolithic rock engravings and gain insights into prehistoric life, and Karapuzha Dam to study its engineering features and significance in irrigation and regional development. The trip offered valuable hands-on learning, effectively linking theoretical knowledge with Kerala's rich archaeological and cultural heritage.





Documentary screening on Oppenheimer

As part of the 1st Semester B.Sc. (FYUGP) syllabus, the Department of Malayalam, KAHM Unity Women's College, Manjeri, organized a special programme on 28 October 2025 at the Digital Studio Room. The event featured the screening of "Oppenheimer: Lokangalude Anthakan" — Episode 151 of the popular Asianet series "Vallathoru Kadha", presented by Babu Ramachandran. Babu Ramachandran's powerful and engaging presentation style was particularly commendable. Following the screening, Asst. Moreover, it inspired deep reflection among students on the catastrophic consequences of war and evoked a collective hope that such destruction should never recur.



One-Day Workshop on Project Management

A One-Day Workshop on Project Management for English undergraduates titled "UG Project: A Road Map" was successfully conducted on 14 October 2025 by the PG & Research Department of English at KAHM Unity Women's College, Manjeri. Creating Living Landscapes: A Terrarium-Making Experience

The PG and Research Department of Botany organized a hands-on training session on Terrarium Preparation titled “Creating Living Landscapes: A Terrarium-Making Experience” on 8th October 2025. The session conducted by the First Semester B.Sc. Botany (Honours) students with the objective of providing them with practical exposure to sustainable indoor gardening techniques and plant care. During the training, students designed and assembled both open and closed terrariums using essential materials such as glass containers, soil mixtures, pebbles, moss and decorative elements. A variety of plant species suitable for terrarium environments were carefully selected and artistically arranged. The activity enabled students to understand the ecological principles behind self-sustaining miniature ecosystems while also developing an appreciation for the aesthetic aspects of plant arrangement. The participants exhibited keen interest, creativity and enthusiasm throughout the session. This experiential learning activity not only enhanced their practical skills but also fostered environmental awareness and a deeper appreciation of plant diversity. The programme coordinated by Dr. Deepa P. and Ms. Anusree M., turned out to be a successful one.



Resin embedding of botanicals

The students of the first semester B.Sc. Botany organized a hands-on program titled “Resin Embedding of Botanicals” on 17th October 2025 as part of their academic curriculum. The activity aimed to provide students with practical experience in preserving plant materials through resin embedding - a creative and scientific method used to conserve botanical specimens for educational and decorative purposes. During the session, students selected and prepared various plant materials such as seeds and flowers for embedding. Using appropriate silicon moulds, they mixed resin and hardener in correct proportions and carefully poured the mixture over the plant materials to create durable and transparent botanical specimens. The process helped students understand the principles of embedding techniques, material handling, and aesthetic presentation. The activity not only enhanced their practical skills but also fostered creativity and appreciation for botanical art and preservation techniques. The programme was conducted under the guidance of faculty members from the PG and Research Department of Botany.



Collection Trip to Munnar and Kodaikanal

The department organized a Taxonomic Collection Trip to Munnar and Kodaikanal as part of the 3rd Semester M.Sc. Botany curriculum on 24-27 October 2025. The trip aimed to provide students with hands-on experience in plant identification, classification and herbarium preparation, and to help them study the diverse vegetation types and plant families prescribed in their syllabus. The program aimed to familiarize students with the floral diversity of the Western Ghats, as well as the morphological and ecological characteristics of various plant species, and to train them in field collection and preservation techniques used in plant taxonomy. The group, comprising postgraduate students and faculty members, explored the biodiversity-rich regions of Munnar and Kodaikanal, where they observed a wide range of vegetation types including tropical evergreen forests, shola-grassland ecosystems and montane vegetation. Students actively participated in the collection, observation and documentation of plant specimens from different habitats such as forest patches, grasslands, plantations and roadside areas. They identified species belonging to different families such as Sterculiaceae, Menispermaceae, Meliaceae, Aizoaceae, Orchidaceae and Poaceae, among others. Each specimen collected was carefully examined for its morphological features and properly labelled with details such as habitat, altitude and locality. The collected materials were pressed between newspapers and cardboards using field presses to remove moisture and later mounted on herbarium sheets for academic reference. Through this systematic process, students gained practical training in herbarium techniques, plant classification and ecological documentation, while also developing an appreciation for the importance of conserving native and endemic flora. The coordinators were Dr. Deepa P., Ms. Husna Banu and Ms. Nishma.

Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) meeting for the 1st, 3rd, and 5th semester B.Sc. Botany programmes were held on 31st October 2025. Community Nutrition Camp & Stalls At NIRAV 2025 – Kisan Mela, Tanalur

The staff and students of the PG Department of Home Science participated in NIRAV 2025 – Kisan Mela, jointly organized by the Department of Agriculture Development and Farmers Welfare and the Local Self Government Department (LSGD) at Tanur Block on 11th and 12th October 2025. The event was inaugurated by the Hon. Minister Sri. V. Abdurahiman. As a community outreach activity, a Nutrition Camp was arranged by the PG students of the department to assess the BMI and BP of the people visiting the Mela and to provide personalised diet counselling, supported with a display of food choices during diabetes, hypertension and anaemia. A sales counter with cakes, snacks, handicrafts and fancy items prepared by the student entrepreneurs of the department, namely, Ms. Shifa Rinshi (III Sem MSc Home Science – Nutrition & Dietetics), Ms. Aslamiya, and Ms. Fathima Farha (V Sem BSc FCS), and Ms. Hana Shihab NK (I Sem BSc FCS) was also organised to promote entrepreneurship skills among the students. At the sales counter, the microgreens prepared by Ms. Shahla K., Assistant Professor (Adhoc), PG Department of Home Science gained the attention of the people. Also, Ms. Sulaikha Gaffoor (B.Sc. Home Science, 1993-1996 batch), a prominent Alumni entrepreneur of the department, exhibited her products 'Mukthy's Curcum Vita', a series of immunity-boosting products, which also received wide appreciation. More than 400 people visited the stall, including the Hon. Minister and Sri. Kurukkoli Moideen, MLA, Tanur. The BMI assessment revealed that 38% of participants were within the normal range, 51% were overweight or obese, and 4% were underweight. Students provided individual diet counselling, emphasizing balanced nutrition and lifestyle modification. Ms. Hana Shihab N.K., I Semester B.Sc. FCS, participated in the Mushroom Recipe Competition conducted as part of the Mela and secured the third prize. A total of 21 UG and PG students and two faculty members participated in the programme. Lt. Loosiya KP, Assistant Professor (Adhoc) and Ms. Fathima Henna Palliyan, III Semester M.Sc. Home Science (Nutrition and Dietetics), served as the faculty and student coordinators respectively. The participation in the Mela resulted in the positive outcomes such as increased public awareness on healthy eating including enhanced public visibility, students' exposure to community-based nutrition programmes fostering empathy, communication, problem solving skills and encouragement of entrepreneurship.

The video presentation systematically explained the step-by-step procedures of performing CPR, including checking for responsiveness, calling for emergency assistance, proper hand placement, chest compressions, rescue breathing, and the use of an automated external defibrillator (AED). After the video session, participants took the CPR Oath, pledging to respond confidently in emergencies and promote CPR awareness. This initiative enhanced students' understanding of emergency life support measures and encouraged them to be proactive in learning practical CPR skills. Seventy-five students participated in this awareness session. This program was effectively coordinated by the faculty Ms.Farsana Shirin K (Assistant Professor (Adhoc) Department of Home Science) and the student Ms.Shana A K (3rd Sem.BSc. FCS).


World Habitat Day (Awareness Video)




