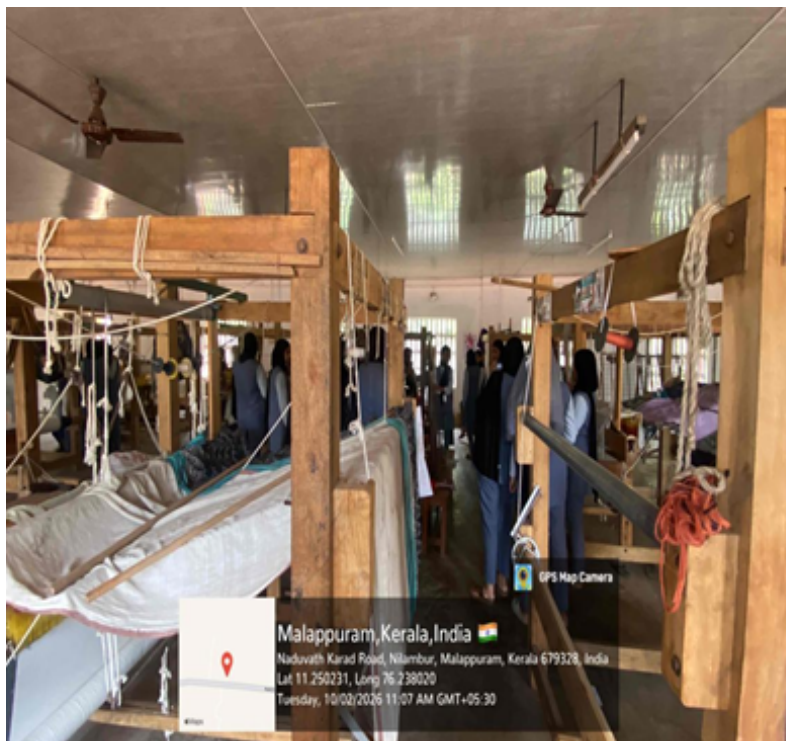
Gender Equity Program: “The Small Steps towards Empowerment”.

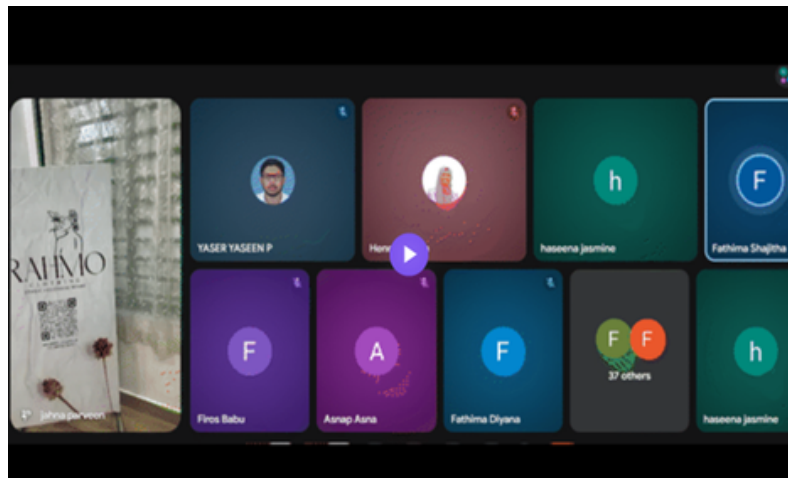
National Seminar on Investment Awareness

MOU with Team Akam Mind Care, Valanchery

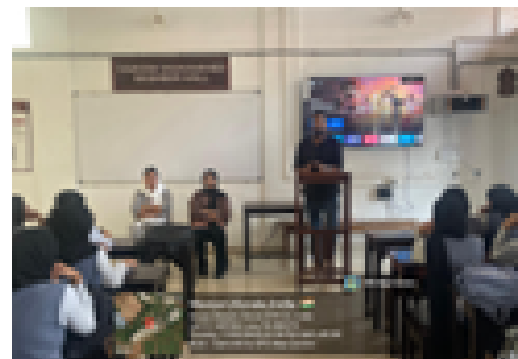

Visit to Trishla Shawl Factory, Kullu

On 9th February 2026, 34 students and staff members from the PG Department of Home Science visited the Trishla Shawl Factory located in Kullu, the capital town of Kullu district in the Indian state of Himachal Pradesh. The visit was organized with the objective of providing students with practical exposure and firsthand knowledge of traditional weaving techniques and textile craftsmanship. Kullu is widely known for its rich handloom heritage. Kullu shawls, Kullu caps, mufflers, and other woollen products are among the most famous woven products of the region. During the visit, students were introduced to the entire shawl weaving process, starting from wool selection and yarn preparation to designing, and weaving. The factory staff demonstrated the functioning of loom and explained the techniques used to create traditional Kullu patterns. Students also gained knowledge about quality control, finishing processes, and marketing of handloom products. The visit provided valuable experiential learning, helping students understand the importance of traditional textiles, skill-based craftsmanship, and the role of handloom industries in supporting local livelihoods and preserving cultural heritage. The interaction with skilled artisans enhanced students' appreciation of manual weaving techniques and sustainable textile practices.



Visit to Indian Institute of Public Health (IIPH-PHFI)

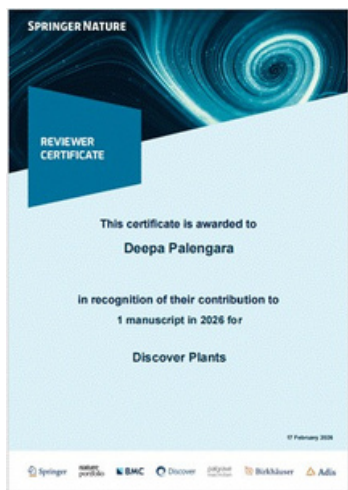
Firing Practice at Farook College Firing Range

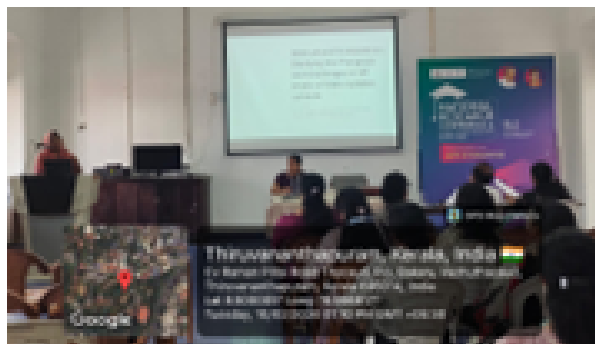
