## Algal Collection Trip to Thikkodi and Algal Herbarium Preparation

The Monthly Communique

On the 25th of February 2025, the department an algal collection trip to Thikkodi, a coastal area in Kerala. The trip was specifically aimed at helping second-semester M.Sc. Botany students gain practical knowledge of algal species found in marine ecosystems. The main objective of the trip was to enhance the students' understanding of algal diversity, their ecological roles, and their identification in natural habitats and collect few species as given in syllabus for herbarium preparation. Students were divided into small groups and assigned specific areas of the coastline. They collected samples of different types of algae, including Caulerpa racemosa, Caulerpa taxifolia, Padina, Gracilaria, Champia and Dictyota. The next phase of the activity involved preparing an algal herbarium. Students were taught the proper techniques for pressing, drying, and mounting algae specimens onto herbarium sheets.

Jumna K and Anshida KP (alumnae, the 2019-2022 B.Com Cooperation batch) qualified the UGC NET Exam.




#### NAVANIRMAN – Education Expo 2025 at St. Mary's College, Puthanangadi

As a part of open-ended activity, the department of History Conducted an Experiential learning trip to Kannur for second Semester Students. 52 Students and two teachers participated.








