


Department of Psychology




The Department of Psychology bagged second place in the Onam Pookalam competition, held on September 12, 2024, as part of the Meridia Students Union's Onam celebrations.

SWACHH BHARAT DIWAS -Pledge




Invited Talk Series Season 2


