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#### **COLLEGE PROFILE**

KAHM Unity Women's College was established in 1991 and is run by Muslim Educational and Cultural Association (MECA), a registered society. Started as a First Grade Aided College affiliated to the University of Calicut, it is the first multi-disciplinary (Arts, Science & Commerce) women's college in Malappuram District. It has also the unique distinction of being the first institution of this kind run by the Muslim Community in Kerala. The institution aims mainly at the upliftment of women in general and the educationally backward Muslim women in particular, through quality education.

Situated 1.6 km off Manjeri-Calicut Road, at 'Koodakkara', the college currently runs 10 undergraduate and 7 postgraduate programmes in a panoramic setting with enchanting greenery. Chemistry and English Departments are upgraded as Research Departments during 2022-23. The college has creditable academic as well as co-curricular accomplishments till date. Transportation facilities, hostel, physical fitness centre, indoor stadium, library with internet facilities, incubation centre, and full-fledged IT labs make the college one of the most sought after in the district. The college is included in UGC 2f and 12B during 1998. The college is received minority status from National Commission for Minority Education Institution (NCMEI) on 2010. The college has been reaccredited in 2019 (third cycle) by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) with CGPA 2.77 at B<sup>++</sup> Grade.



#### FOUNDER PRESIDENT & MANAGER



Jb. Korambayil Ahamed Haji (1930–2003)

Korambayil Ahamed Haji, former Secretary of Kerala State Muslim League and the founder of Unity Women's College was known as a 'gentle man politician'. He was not only a politician, but also a lover of art, games, sports, football in particular, and literature, who represented Mankada and Kuttippuram constituencies in Kerala Assembly. A deputy speaker once, he was later elected to Rajya Sabha. As a recognition of his services to the Mappila art & literature, he was awarded 'Kalaprathiba Rathnam'. It was during his tenure as chairman that the dream of Mahakavi Moyinkutty Vaidyar Smarakam materialized. Having a long association with Hidayathul Muslimeen Sabha Manjeri as general secretary, he was the president of Manjeri Central Mahallu. He was the secretary of Mampad College which was later handed over to MES. In 1991, his dream of founding an Arts & Science college for women in Manjeri was fulfilled when Unity Women's College was inaugurated by Syed Mohammed Ali Shihab Thangal at a function chaired by Dr. T. K. Raveendran, the then Vice-chancellor of Calicut University. He was the president of Muslim Educational and Cultural Association as well as the Manager of Unity Women's College. In recognition of his invaluable contributions to the college, the institution was later renamed in his honor. A memorial speech is held in each year on 18th December and celebrated as Foundation Day.

#### FOUNDER GENERAL SECRETARY



Jb. Hassan Mahmood Kurikkal (1950–2012)

Jb. Hassan Mahmood Kurikkal was the founder General Secretary of Unity Women's College, who was then the President of Malappuram District Council. Born in the Kurikkal family of Manjeri, he had his UG education at Farook college and LLB from Aligarh Muslim University.

Opting legal practice in Manjeri, he later became a full-time politician, and eventually became the Municipal Chairman and also the first and last president of Malappuram District Council. Falling sick during his presidency, bedridden for about 15 years, his strong will and compassion kept him strong enough to be significantly involved in solving people's problems. His was the last word in Manjeri politics, especially in the coalition politics. He served Unity College as its first General Secretary for about two decades.

#### **PRESIDENT**



Sayyid Munavvar Ali Shihab Thangal

Sayyid Munavvar Ali Shihab Thangal is the President of KAHM Unity Women's College Committee. Born on 18<sup>th</sup> May 1977, he is the son of a great visionary, Sayyid Mohammadali Shihab Thangal and grandson of Jb. Panakkad Pookoya Thangal. He is a social worker, philanthropist, educationalist and youth leader. He is a renowned scholar and traveller with wide personal friendship all over the world. He is the State President of Muslim Youth League Committee.

He had his education in Crescent School Vendallur (Chennai), Farook College and International Islamic University, Kualalumpur, Malaysia. He is instrumental in linking Unity Women's College with the group of European and Indian universities under the MIELES Project of the European Union, coordinated by Barcelona University, Spain. He is the flag bearer of many other educational and philanthropic movements.



Adv. U. A. Lathif, MLA

Adv. U.A. Lathif is one of the members founding of Unity Women's College. He served as the first Vice President and has been the General Secretary since 2017, succeeding Adv. Hassan Mahmood Kurikkal. He has also served as Municipal Chairman of Manjeri and General Secretary Malappuram District Muslim League Committee. He is renowned lawyer in Manjeri Bar current president and the Malappuram District Cooperative Bank. An ardent orator, he had his education at NSS College Manjeri, Farook College and Law College, Ernakulam. He was elected to the Assembly for Kerala Manjeri constituency in 2021. Despite his involvement and engagement in many other fields, he leads the developmental activities of the college.



Jb. O. Abdul Ali

Born in Manjeri in 1948, he had his education at Farook College and Govt. Engineering College, Thrissur. After education he served the Indian Airlines, Bangalore; Kerala State Electricity Board, Manjeri; and the Engineering Department of Calicut University. He was one of the founding members of Unity Women's College and succeeded Jb. Korambayil Ahamed Haji as Manager of the college in 2003. A member of the Syndicate of Calicut University from 2013 to 2017, he is one of the Joint Secretaries of Kerala Private College Management Association and Federation of Muslim Colleges. He represented the college in MIELES Program in Barcelona, Stockholm, Nicosia and Berlin.

# PROGRAMMES OF STUDY

## CHOICE BASED CREDIT SEMESTER SYSTEM (CBCSS)

The CBCSS system is a University Grants Commission initiative that enhances and promotes educational liberalization of traditional higher education models. As an internationally recognized system, CBCSS provides opportunities and avenues for learning core subjects while also exploring additional avenues of learning beyond core subjects for an individual's holistic development. It provides a learning platform in which the student or knowledge seeker can select a course from a list of elective, core, and soft skill courses. CBCSS allows students to study at different times and at different institutions to complete a single course. Under this system, Credits earned at one institution can be transferred. At University of Calicut, the system was first implemented in the 2009-10 academic year, and the Board of Studies revised the CBCSS UG Regulation in 2019 to make it applicable to all Regular and SDE UG programmes. The system will be monitored in colleges affiliated with the University of Calicut by a College Level Monitoring Committee led by the Principal.

MOODLE LMS for online evaluation and tests is implemented in the college.

#### **COLLEGE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (CMS)**

CMS is a central data repository for organizing, analysing, storing and processing the data. It generates various reports and formats for supporting the functions of teaching, learning, evaluation, IQAC, office administration, etc. CMS was implemented successfully in the 2018-19 after a successful quality check. It is an online in-house customized software product, developed and maintained by the Postgraduate Department of Computer Science of our college. CMS is designed to monitor the performance of education programs offered by the college, to manage and support the administrative activities and to provide support to IQAC. CMS reduces the

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workload of teachers by providing quick access to data on any student or a group of students which can be drilled down, filtered, and arranged accordingly within a few clicks. Additionally, it keeps track of the college transportation facility, examination management etc.

#### EMBASE - ENTERPRISE RESOURCE PLANNING (ERP)

EMBASE is a cloud-based ERP is implemented as an efficient solution to maintain a sound balance of academic progress, student success and administrative affairs. Our modules work in sync to create a perfect balance. Improved teaching and learning with access to real time data and analytics tools such as configurable dashboards. Furthermore, we promise that it provides an excellent digital experience to the students.

# RASHTRIYA UCHCHATAR SHIKSHA ABHIYAN (RUSA)

It is a holistic scheme of development for higher education in India initiated in 2013 by the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Government of India. The central funding (in the ratio of 60:40 for general category States, 90:10 for special category states and 100% for union territories) would be norm based and outcome dependent. The funding would flow from the Central Ministry through the State Governments/Union Territories to the State Higher Education Councils before reaching the identified institutions. Our college has been selected under the RUSA 2.0 Scheme. A sum of Rs. 2 crores are being allotted for construction, renovation and purchase. The construction and renovation works are completed under Nirmiti Kendra, Malappuram.

#### NATIONAL INSTITUTE RANKING FRAMEWORK (NIRF)

The NIRF was inaugurated under the auspices of the Ministry of Human Resource Development and unveiled by the distinguished Minister on September 29, 2015. This framework provides a meticulously structured methodology for the comprehensive assessment and ranking of educational institutions on a national scale. In alignment with this endeavour, our college has established a committee tasked with implementing essential measures to secure our college's inclusion in the NIRF rankings.

## ALL INDIA SURVEY ON HIGHER EDUCATION (AISHE)

To portray the status of higher education in the country, Ministry of Education has endeavoured to conduct an annual web-based AISHE since 2010-11. The survey covers all the Institutions in the country engaged in imparting of higher education. Data is being collected on several parameters such as teachers, student enrolment, programmes, examination results, education finance, infrastructure. Indicators of educational development such as Institution Density, Gross Enrolment Ratio, Pupil-teacher ratio, Gender Parity Index, Per Student Expenditure will also be calculated from the data collected through AISHE. These are useful in making informed policy decisions and research for development of education sector.

## **COLLEGE RULES & REGULATIONS**

#### **General Rules**

- 1. Use of mobile phones is restricted in the college campus (other than the monitored use).
- 2. Students shall behave with dignity and courtesy in the college.
- 3. Students shall always carry identity cards with them.
- 4. Political or such organizational activities of the students shall not be permitted in the campus.
- 5. Meeting of any kind shall not be organized or any sort of fund is to be collected without the permission of the Principal.
- 6. Students shall not indulge in any kind of misdemeanour bringing disgrace to the institution.
- 7. Students shall not entertain visitors without prior permission.
- 8. Prescribed uniform is compulsory for the students on all days.
- 9. Government has made it clear that ragging in any form should be sternly and effectively prevented. Whenever a criminal offense is committed in the name of ragging whether within the campus of an educational

- institution or in a hostel or otherwise, the Principal or Warden will report at the nearest Police Station and not wait until a complaint in this regard is received from the person affected. Appropriate disciplinary action will also be taken against the accused.
- 10. The transportation facility offered by the Management Committee of the college is a facility which is not obligatory. Students using college bus facility shall strictly follow the rules of the Bus Committee.
- 11. Each student shall be a member of one of the clubs.

#### Fee and Attendance Regulations

- 12. Students who do not enjoy fee concession shall remit the fees, which will be collected in the office, in 2 terms on the days noted in the calendar and also as notified from time to time.
- 13. Fee will be collected in the college office only on the specified collection days from 09.30 am to 04.30 pm.
- 14. No student shall be absent from the class without giving leave application.
- 15. Students absenting themselves without leave for ten consecutive working days will be struck off the rolls.
- 16. Application for leave in the specified format (available in the college co-operative store) shall be forwarded to the HoD through the class tutor.
- 17. The Attendance Progress Certificate (APC) required for appearing in University examinations will not be granted unless the HoD is satisfied with the attendance, conduct, and progress of the student.

### **Disciplinary Rules**

- 1. Students are responsible for their conduct within the college premises and are prohibited from doing anything, either inside or outside the college, which will amount to a breach of discipline or interference in the smooth functioning of the college. A student shall be liable to disciplinary action for any act of indiscipline. Disciplinary action may involve a warning and/or suspension from classes, from the college library, or even from the college as decided by the College Discipline Committee.
- 2. Students shall behave themselves in a civil and dignified manner, and refrain from offensive behaviour towards any section of the college community. Uncivilized behaviour and/or language shall be sternly dealt with.

- 3. A student who faces any disciplinary action shall not be eligible for any special recognition from the college. This includes all kinds of participation in intra-college and inter-college activities, scholarships, financial assistance provided to students, and participation in the college festival and all other sports activities.
- 4. Students shall maintain silence and decorum in classrooms and desist from disorderly behaviour. They must not loiter in the corridors or in front of classrooms or office rooms and create noise. During their free periods, students are advised to work in the library or reading room, without causing any disturbance whatsoever. Verbal abuses will also be considered as violations of discipline.
- 5. Possession or consumption of alcohol/ drug or any other addictive/illegal material is strictly prohibited in the college premises and will lead to termination of the student from the college.
- 6. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited and is a punishable offense. Anyone involved in such cases will be dealt with a very strict antiragging policy.
- 7. Students shall take proper care of the college furniture and fixtures. They must not cause any damage to the college property.
- 8. Students are notified to not litter, lay or throw any kind of garbage in and around the campus.
- 9. A designated parking space is provided for all students to park their vehicle. No vehicle is allowed to be parked in any other part of the college premises.
- 10. Students suffering from any contagious or infectious diseases are suggested to not attend college during the phase of illness.
- 11. Students who are regularly absent from the college for no valid reasons will be removed from the college rolls.
- 12. All notices/circulars issued from time to time will be binding on all students without exception.
- 13. Joining hands with Sustainable Development Goals, our campus adheres to the principle of a Green Campus. All stake holders must be responsible for protecting and preserving its biodiversity, and conserving resources.

# **COLLEGE LIBRARY**

The College Library is working on a separate multi-facility building with an area of 5000 square feet. The College library has a collection of 21693 volumes and 81 periodicals. All the collections in the library are classified and catalogued according to DDC (Dewey Decimal Classification) scheme. The library is completely computerized with standard library software. OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) is provided to locate the documents available in the library quickly. Internet access facilities are also available in the library. There is a good collection of standard text books in all subjects and reference materials such as dictionaries, encyclopaedias, directories, etc. in the reference reading room which shall not be taken out. Text book section contains standard text books in all subjects. They are loaned to deserving students for a period of one year with a normal fee.

#### **Library Rules**

- 1. Library users must enter their borrower number at the time of check-in and checkout.
- 2. Strict discipline and silence shall be observed in the library.
- 3. Membership of the library is extended to all students of the college. The number of books issued to a PG student at a time is not be more than five and that to a UG student is not be more than three.
- 4. For availing this facility, the students shall submit an application in the prescribed form.
- 5. They are entitled to borrow books on the production of identity card.
- 6. Loss of identity card should be intimated to the librarian immediately in writing. A fine of Rs.70/- will be levied for each card lost.
- 7. Due date is 14 days from the date of issue. They can be renewed for a period of 14 days, if no one else has reserved for the same. If the books are not returned on or before the due date, a fine of 1 rupee per day will have to be remitted.
- 8. Absence from the college will not be accepted as an excuse for delay in

- returning the books.
- 9. If a book is lost, it can be replaced by a copy of same edition or 4 times the cost of the book and overdue charge has to be paid.
- 10. Those who borrow books from the library are requested to examine them carefully and report damages if any to the library assistant. The borrower will be held responsible for any damage found at the time of returning the books other than the damages already reported.
- 11. The librarian reserves the right to recall at any time any book issued from the library.
- 12. Personal belongings should be kept in the property counter before entering into the library.
- 13. Books, journals and all other library materials should be handled with care, preserving them for future generations.
- 14. Seek the help of library staff in using the library and in locating books.
- 15. Ear marking, tracing, underlining and writing in books shall be avoided.
- 16. Transfer certificate will be issued only after clearing all the dues in the library.
- 17. The members of teaching staff are allowed to borrow 10 books and non-teaching staffs are allowed to borrow 3 books at a time, due date is 30 days from the date of issue.
- 18. A member of staff who takes leave for more than one month must return all the books borrowed from the library before proceeding on leave.
- 19. Students and staff are directed to carry their identity cards while visiting the library.

#### UNITY COLLEGE ALUMNI ASSOCIATION (UCAA)

The college is proud of having a functioning Alumni; UCAA. UCAA has clear objectives of making people connected for the cultural interest of its members and for the development of the college. Annual Alumni Meet, Cultural fest with feast, Alumni Lecture Series, Workshops, Green

Campus etc. are some among the exciting programs of our Alumni. UCAA is going to publish an ISBN book "Priyamanu Unity" in this academic year. 2nd Saturday of July in each year is our Alumni day for a whole day long celebration. A Mega Alumni meet is planned to be conducted on 2nd week of January 2024. UCAA is happy to welcome its members with the Facebook page "Younity14" and Instagram page "unityalumniassociation" too.

#### **SOLAR POWERED CAMPUS**

The college has installed a 45kW on-grid solar power plant in the campus with the financial assistance of PTA. The panels are strategically positioned to maximize sunlight exposure and convert the generated electricity into a form compatible with the college's electrical system. The on-grid system allows the college to sell excess electricity back to KSEB and draw electricity from the grid when needed. The 45kW capacity indicates the peak power output of the solar power plant. This initiative promotes renewable energy and contributes to a greener and more sustainable environment for the college.

#### SHARE AND CARE

Share and Care was introduced as an innovative campus philanthropic project by the IQAC to make students and staff, empathizing and caring for the underprivileged lives around. "Save ten rupee per month, Save the lives around" is the motto of the programme. Faculty members have also been contributing their shares. The project is identified as one of the best practices of the college and has been continuing successfully. Different kinds of welfare projects have been undertaken under the aegis of Share and Care with the leadership of IQAC.

# STUDENT'S SUPPORT SCHEMES

#### **TUTORIAL SYSTEM**

Tutorial system of the institution supports holistic development of our wards supporting them in their academic, social and emotional aspects, assisted by tutors or through other relevant agencies. # **CO-OPERATIVE STORE**

Text Books and Stationary materials and some consumable items are been sold through the college cooperative store. All the staff and students are members of the society. The profit is shared with the members and so materials are sold at rates lower than the market rates. Printing and photocopy facility is also available in the store.

#### **NETWORK RESOURCE CENTRE (NRC)**

To keep abreast with the changing scenario in higher education, employment and research a NRC is set up in the campus. The centre, functioning in the college library, has broad band internet facility accessible to all students and staff.

#### MIELES DIGITAL STUDIO

Modernizing and Enhancing Indian eLearning Educational Strategies (MIELES) is a European Commission funded project which collaborates Indian institutions with European Institutions. Our college is the one and only Arts and Science College from Kerala with this collaboration. The college has established a Digital Studio in 2020 under MIELES project to promote virtual learning through content creation and live stream or record lectures/courses by the faculties.

#### NON-RESIDENT STUDENT'S CENTRE (NRSC)

NRSC in the college campus provides common space for socialization among students. It inculcates independence, multiculturalism, peaceful co-existence and healthy communications. Extracurricular, cocurricular activities are organized on a regular basis at NRSC.

#### RESIDENTIAL FACILITY

The college hostel functions in a permanent building in the campus. Hostel accommodation is available for a limited number of students. Those who wish to join the hostel shall submit a separate application after obtaining admission in the college and shall pay the establishment charges and caution deposit at the time of admission. The mess dues (on dividing system basis) and rent are to be paid monthly. The Principal of the college is the chief warden. The Chief Warden's decision will be the final in the admission and removal of students from the hostel. A faculty member nominated by the Principal will be the Deputy Warden. The inmates shall strictly adhere the following hostel rules.

1. Students should maintain personal hygiene and also keep their rooms and surroundings clean.

- 2. The study time will be from 6.30 P.M. to 10.30 P.M. (excluding the dinner time and 15 minutes for recreation).
- 3. Students should strictly maintain silence and should not get involved in other entertaining activities during study hours.
- 4. Ragging and other offensive activities are strictly prohibited in the hostel. If found guilty, the concerned students will have to face disciplinary actions including legal formalities.
- 5. The penalty for the offences committed in the hostel shall warrant punishments from the college too, since the hostel is a part of the institution.
- 6. Inmates of the hostel should maintain table manners and keep discipline in the dining hall.
- 7. Hostel dues should be cleared each month. If not followed, the defaulter's names shall be removed from the roll.
- 8. No inmates shall leave the hostel without permission from the Deputy Warden (the request to be given in written format). The hostel gate shall remain closed after 06:00 P.M.
- 9. The behaviour of the students towards the hostel authorities, staff and caretakers should be amiable and polite.
- 10. Day scholars or outsiders are not permitted to visit the hostel without the permission of the Deputy Warden.

## STUDENTS AID FUND (SAF)

## CALICUT UNIVERSITY SOCIAL SERVICE PROGRAMME (CUSSP)

All students shall undergo a minimum of 42 days of social service work during the course (3 years) for awarding their degree. Main objectives of NCC are to develop qualities of character, courage, comradeship, discipline, leadership, secular outlook, spirit of adventure and the ideals of selfless service among youth to make them useful citizen.

Professional courses Rs. 30000/- (eligibility criteria-the candidate should have 80% attendance in NCC, 65 % mark in Science, 60% in Commerce, 55% in Arts stream in XII, should have completed at least 1 year of NCC in SW).

### NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The main objective of NSS is to create a spirit of service among students to the fellow being and to the society. It also aims at the personality development of students by interaction and participation in various social and cultural activities. Every student completing 240 hours of social work and attending one special camp will be eligible for a certificate issued by University, which fetches 5 marks weightage for higher study. There are two units of N.S.S (Unit No. 171 and Unit No. 8) in the college each having an enrolment strength of 100.

The 45kW capacity indicates the peak power output of the solar power plant. 
