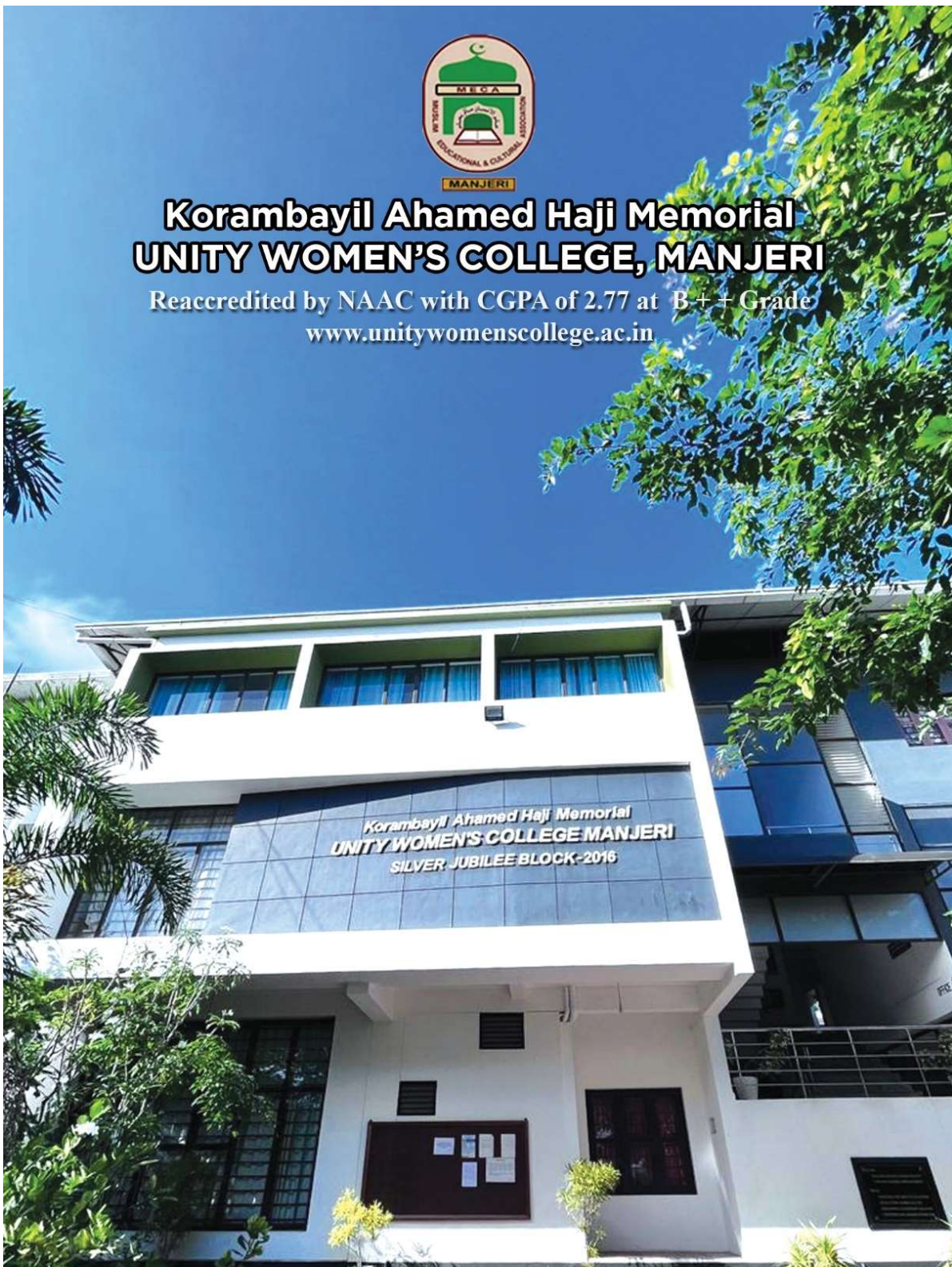

FOUNDER MANAGER



KORAMBAYIL AHAMED HAJI
(1930–2003)

Korambayil Ahamed Haji, former Secretary of Kerala State Muslim League and the founder of Unity Women's College was known as a 'gentle man politician'. He was not only a politician, but also a lover of art, games, sports, football in particular, and literature, who represented Mankada and Kuttippuram constituencies in Kerala Assembly. A deputy speaker once, he was later elected to Rajya Sabha. As a recognition of his services to the Mappila art & literature, he was awarded 'Kalaprathiba Rathnam'. It was during his tenure as chairman that the dream of Mahakavi Moyinkutty Vaidyar Smarakam materialized.

Having a long association with Hidayathul Muslimeen Sabha Manjeri as general secretary, he was the president of Manjeri Central Mahallu. He was the secretary of Mampad College which was later handed over to MES. In 1991 his dream of founding an Arts & Science college in Manjeri was fulfilled when Unity Women's College was inaugurated by Syed Mohammed Ali ShihabThangal at a function chaired by Dr. T K Raveendran, the then Vice-chancellor of Calicut University. He was the president of Muslim Educational and Cultural Association as well as the manager of Unity Women's College.





FOUNDER GENERAL SECRETARY








Jb. HASSAN MAHMOOD KURIKKAL
(1950–2012)

Jb. Hassan Mahmood Kurikkal was the founder General Secretary of Unity Women's College, who was then the President of Malappuram District Council. Born in the Kurikkal family of Manjeri, he had his UG education at Farook college and took his LLB from Aligarh Muslim University. Opting legal practice in Manjeri, he later became a full-time politician, and eventually became the Municipal Chairman and also the first and last president of Malappuram District Council. Falling sick during his presidency, bedridden for about 15 years, his strong will and compassion kept him strong enough to be significantly involved in solving people's problems. His was the last word in Manjeri politics, especially in the coalition politics. He served Unity College as its first General Secretary for about two decades.

He had his education in Crescent School Vendallur (Chennai), Farook College and International Islamic University, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. He was instrumental in linking Unity Women's College with the group of European and Indian universities under the MIELES Project of the European Union, co-ordinated by Barcelona University, Spain. He is the flag bearer of many other educational and philanthropic movements.

An ardent orator, he had his education at NSS College Manjeri, Farook college and Law College, Ernakulam. He also serves as the General Secretary of Malappuram District Muslim League Committee. He was elected to the Kerala Assembly for Manjeri constituency in 2021. Despite his involvement and engagement in many other fields, he leads the developmental activities of the college.

Born in Manjeri in 1948, he had his education at Farook College Govt. Engineering College, Thrissur. After education he served the Indian Airlines, Bangalore, Kerala State Electricity Board, Manjeri, and the Engineering Dept. Calicut university. He was one of the founding members of Unity Women's College in 1951 and succeeded Janab Korambayil Ahamed Haji as manager of the college in 2003. A member of the syndicate of Calicut university from 2013 to 2017, he is one of the joint secretaries of Kerala Private College Management Association and Federation of Muslim Colleges. He represented the college in MIELES Program in Bangalore, Stockholm, Nicosia and Berlin.

COLLEGE PROFILE

KAHM Unity Women's College was established in 1991 and is run by Muslim Educational and Cultural Association (MECA), a registered society. Started as a First Grade Aided College affiliated to the University of Calicut, it is the first multi-faculty (Arts, Science & Commerce) women's college in Malappuram District. It has also the unique distinction of being the only institution of this kind run by the Muslim Community in Kerala. The institution aims mainly at the upliftment of women in general and the educationally backward Muslim women in particular, through modern good quality education.

Situated 1.6 km off Manjeri-Calicut Road, at 'Koodakkara', the college currently runs 10 undergraduate and 7 postgraduate courses in a panoramic setting with enchanting greenery. The college has creditable academic as well as co-curricular accomplishments till date. Transportation and hostel facilities, physical fitness centre, indoor stadium, library with internet facilities, and full-fledged IT labs make the college one of the most sought after in the District. The college has been reaccredited in 2019 (third cycle) by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) with CGPA 2.77 at B++ Grade.

RASHTRIYA UCHCHATAR SHIKSHA ABHIYAN (RUSA)

It is a holistic scheme of development for higher education in India initiated in 2013 by the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Government of India. The central funding (in the ratio of 60:40 for general category States, 90:10 for special category states and 100% for union territories) would be norm based and outcome dependent. The funding would flow from the Central Ministry through the State Governments/Union Territories to the State Higher Education Councils before reaching the identified institutions. Our college has been selected under the RUSA 2.0 Scheme. A sum of Rs. 2 crores are being allotted for construction, renovation and purchase under components numbers 8 and 9. NATIONAL INSTITUTE RANKING FRAMEWORK (NIRF)

The National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) was approved by the MHRD and launched by Honourable Minister of Human Resource Development on 29th September 2015. This framework outlines a methodology to rank

institutions across the country. The methodology draws from the overall recommendations broad understanding arrived at by a Core Committee set up by MHRD, to identify the broad parameters for ranking various universities and institutions. The parameters broadly cover “Teaching, Learning and Resources,” “Research and Professional Practices,” “Graduation Outcomes,” “Outreach and Inclusivity,” and “Perception”.

ALL INDIA SURVEY ON HIGHER EDUCATION (AISHE)

To portray the status of higher education in the country, Ministry of Education has endeavoured to conduct an annual web-based All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE) since 2010-11. The survey covers all the Institutions in the country engaged in imparting of higher education. Data is being collected on several parameters such as teachers, student enrolment, programmes, examination results, education finance, infrastructure. Indicators of educational development such as Institution Density, Gross Enrolment Ratio, Pupil-teacher ratio, Gender Parity Index, Per Student Expenditure will also be calculated from the data collected through AISHE. These are useful in making informed policy decisions and research for development of education sector.

COLLEGE RULES

A. General:

Whenever a criminal offense is committed in the name of ragging whether within the campus of an educational institution or in a hostel or otherwise, the Principal or Warden will report at the nearest Police Station and not wait until a complaint in this regard is received from the person affected. Appropriate disciplinary action will also be taken against the culprits.
11. The transportation facility offered by the Management Committee of the college is a facility; it cannot be taken as obligatory. Students using college bus facility shall strictly follow the rules of the Bus Committee.
12. Each student shall be a member of one of the clubs.

B. Fee and Attendance Rules:

1. Students who do not enjoy fee concession shall remit the fees, which will be collected in the office, in 2 terms on the days noted in the calendar and also as notified from time to time.
2. Fee will be collected in the college office only on the specified collection days from **9.30 am to 4.00 pm**.
3. No student shall be absent from the class without giving leave application.
4. Students absenting themselves without leave for ten consecutive working days will be struck off the rolls.
5. Application for leave in the specified format (available in the college co-operative store) shall be forwarded to the HoD through the class tutor.
6. The attendance progress certificate (APC) required for appearing in University examinations will not be granted unless the HoD is satisfied with the attendance, conduct, and progress of the student.

C. Disciplinary Rules:

Students are responsible for their conduct within the college premises and are prohibited from doing anything, either inside or outside the college, which will amount to a breach of discipline or interference in the smooth functioning of the college. A student shall be liable to disciplinary action for any act of indiscipline. Disciplinary action may involve a warning and/or suspension from classes, from the college library, or even from the college as decided by the College Discipline Committee.

1. Students shall behave themselves in a civil and dignified manner, and desist from offensive behaviour towards any section of the college community. Uncivilized behaviour and/or language shall be sternly dealt with.
2. A student who faces any disciplinary action shall not be eligible for any special recognition from the college. This includes all kinds of participation in intra-college and inter-college activities, scholarships, financial assistance provided to students, and participation in the college festival and all other sports activities.
3. Students shall maintain silence and decorum in classrooms and desist from disorderly behaviour. They must not loiter in the corridors or in front of classrooms or office rooms and create noise. During their free periods, students are advised to work in the library or reading room, without causing any disturbance whatsoever. Verbal abuses will also be considered as violations of discipline.
4. Possession or the consumption of alcohol/ drug or any other addictive/illegal material is strictly prohibited in the college premises and will lead to termination of the student from the college.

5. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited and is a punishable offense. Anyone involved in such cases will be dealt with a very strict anti-ragging policy.
6. Students shall take proper care of the college furniture and fixtures. They must not cause any damage to the college property.
7. Students are notified to not litter, lay or throw any kind of garbage in and around the campus.
8. A designated parking space is provided for all students to park their vehicle. No vehicle is allowed to be parked in any other part of the college premises.
9. Students suffering from any contagious or infectious diseases are suggested to not attend college during the phase of illness.
10. Students who are regularly absent from the college for no valid reasons will be removed from the college rolls.
11. All notices/circulars issued from time to time will be binding on all students without exception.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

The College Library is working on a separate multi-facility building with an area of 5000 square feet. The College library has a collection of 21693 volumes and 81 periodicals. All the collections in the library are classified and catalogued according to DDC (Dewey Decimal Classification) scheme. The library is completely computerized with standard library software. OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) is provided to locate the documents available in the library quickly. Internet access facilities are also available in the library. There is a good collection of standard text books in all subjects and reference materials such as dictionaries, encyclopaedias, directories, etc. in the reference reading room. Books from the section shall not be allowed to be taken out. Text book section contains standard text books in all subjects. They are loaned to deserving students for a period of one year with a normal fee.

Library Rules

1. Library users must enter their borrower number at the time of check-in and checkout.
2. Strict discipline and silence shall be observed in the library.
3. Membership of the library is extended to all students of the college. The number of books issued to a PG student at a time is not be more than five and that to a UG student is not be more than three.
4. For availing this facility, the students shall submit an application in the prescribed form.
5. They are entitled to borrow books on the production of identity card.
6. Loss of identity card should be intimated to the librarian immediately in writing. A fine of Rs.70/- will be levied for each card lost.
7. Due date is 14 days from the date of issue. They can be renewed for a period of 14 days, if no one else has reserved for the same. If the books are not returned on or before the due date, a fine of 1 rupee per day will have to be remitted.
8. Absence from the college will not be accepted as an excuse for delay in returning the books.
9. If a book is lost, it can be replaced by a copy of same edition or 4 times the cost of the book and overdue charge has to be paid.
10. Those who borrow books from the library are requested to examine them carefully and report damages if any to the library assistant. The borrower will be held responsible for any damage found at the time of returning the books other than the damages already reported.
11. The librarian reserves the right to recall at any time any book issued from the library.
12. Personal belongings should be kept in the property counter before entering into the library.
13. Books, journals and all other library materials should be handled with care, preserving them for future generations.
14. Seek the help of library staff in using the library and in locating books.
15. Ear marking, tracing, underlining and writing in books shall be avoided.
16. Transfer certificate will be issued only after clearing all the dues in the library.
17. The members of teaching staff are allowed to borrow 10 books and non-teaching staffs are allowed to borrow 3 books at a time, due date is 30 days from the date of issue.
18. A member of staff who takes leave for more than one month must return all the books borrowed from the library before proceeding on leave.
19. Students and staff are directed to carry their identity cards while visiting the library.

STUDENT'S SUPPORT SCHEMES

ADDITIONAL SKILL ACQUISITION PROGRAMME (ASAP)

ASAP K-Skill is a government initiative for Higher education institutions to promote employability skills among youth. Under identified skill areas multiple courses are offered, both online and offline, with specific number

of hours and affordable fees. Students benefit by procuring a certificate accredited by renowned institutions/ bodies.

ADVISORY SYSTEM

At the beginning of the academic year, students are grouped into different batches and placed under the personal charge of a teacher designated as 'Tutor'. He/she will keep regular monitoring of the attendance, progress and conduct of students under him/her and will give necessary guidance. Students shall forward all applications including leave to the Principal through the concerned class tutor. University application forms shall be attested by the class tutor. The progress report of the students will also be intimated to parents by the class tutor.

CAMPUS CAFETERIA

It provides healthy and economic food for all students and staff on the campus. Provides a menu that includes breakfast, traditional Kerala lunch, vegetarian meals, and a range of snacks at competitive prices. Cafeteria can conveniently accommodate 100 students at a time. Students are expected to exercise decency and decorum in the cafeteria.

CONVEYANCE FACILITY

A full-fledged transport department functions in the college with buses to provide transport facility to students and staff from various places. This service is offered ensuring a hassle-free and safe transportation. The number of buses will be increased corresponding to the increase in the intake of students. College buses also transport students and faculty to special events, such as field trips or industrial visits. Now seven college buses operate along four different routes starting from different points approximately between 8.30 and 9.30 a.m. Bus service is available on selected routes for the students and the staff. Now College is having bus services to 4 destinations - Manjeri, Kondotty, Malappuram (via Valluvambrum) and Kizhisheru (via Pookkolathur).

NETWORK RESOURCE CENTRE (NRC)

To keep abreast with the changing scenario in higher education, employment and research a Network Resource Centre is set up in the campus. The centre, functioning in the college library, has broad band internet facility accessible to all students and staff.

NON-RESIDENT STUDENT'S CENTRE (NRSC)

NRSC room in the college campus provides common space for socialization among students. NRSC inculcates independence, multi-culturalism, peaceful co-existence and healthy communications. Extra-curricular, co-curricular activities are organized on a regular basis at NRSC.

RESIDENTIAL FACILITY

The college hostel functions in a permanent building in the campus. Hostel accommodation is available for a limited number of students. Those who wish to join the hostel shall submit a separate application after obtaining admission in the college and shall pay the establishment charges and caution deposit at the time of admission. The mess dues and rent are to be paid monthly. The inmates shall strictly adhere the following hostel rules.

1. The Principal of the college will be the chief warden.
2. A faculty member nominated by the Principal will be the Deputy Warden.
3. The Chief Warden's decision will be the final in the admission and removal of students from the hostel.
4. Students should maintain personal hygiene and also keep their rooms and surroundings clean.
5. The study time will be from 6.30 P.M. to 10.30 P.M. (excluding the dinner time and 15 minutes for recreation).
6. Students should strictly maintain silence and should not get involved in other entertaining activities during study hours.
7. Ragging and other offensive activities are strictly prohibited in the hostel. If found guilty, the concerned students will have to pay the penalty and face even legal formalities.
8. Inmates of the hostel should maintain table manners and keep discipline in the dining hall.
9. Hostel dues should be cleared each month. If not followed, the defaulter's names shall be removed from the roll.
10. No inmates shall leave the hostel without permission from the Deputy Warden (the request to be given in written format). The hostel gate shall remain closed after 6 P.M.
11. The behavior of the students towards the hostel authorities, staff and caretakers should be amiable and polite.
12. Day scholars or outsiders are not permitted to visit the hostel without the permission of the Deputy Warden.

The penalty for the offenses committed in the hostel shall warrant punishments from the college too, since the hostel is a part of the institution.

STUDENTS AID FUND (SAF)

For helping very needy and financially backward students a general fund is raised from staff and students in

the form of donations. Selected students will get financial assistance from the SAF. A fund is also raised to meet the monthly bus fare of deserving students by contribution from teachers. It is an institutional alternative for the WWS program- an initiative by the Govt. of Kerala. Career Advancement Sessions, service of career coach, institutional visits, one to one mentoring sessions etc are organised under the aegis of Unity GATE. The platform helps the learners to get correct guidance and direction on higher education after their graduation, based on their aptitudes.

To study advance and provide students with the best of the latest services, our campus has gone Wi-Fi. The campus is wireless-fidelity enabled.

SHARE AND CARE

Share and Care was introduced as an innovative campus philanthropic project during 2016-17 by the IQAC to make students and staff, empathizing and caring for the underprivileged lives around. The idea was conceptualized by the then IQAC coordinator Dr. Muhammed Basheer Ummathur and Shahina Mol A. K., Convenor of Criterion VII, Innovations and Best Practices- 2016-17. “Save ten rupee per month, save the lives around” is the motto of the programme. Shahina Mol A. K., introduced the name for the project and she also served as the founding coordinator of the venture. Faculty members have also been contributing their shares. During the year of introduction, different departments jointly collaborated with IQAC to implement the event. The project is identified as one of the best practices of the college and has been continuing successfully. Different kinds of welfare projects have been undertaken under the aegis of Share and Care with the leadership of IQAC coordinators and convenors, students’ representatives, faculty coordinators and Heads of the departments through the support of entire students and staff.

STATUTORY AND NON-STATUTORY BODIES

CELLS AND COMMITTEES

ANTI-NARCOTIC CELL

The Anti-Narcotics Cell of the college has been established for curbing drug trafficking and use of illegal substances inside the campus. An effective vigilant committee has been constituted in order to execute the functions of the cell and also to impart an awareness campaign against use of drugs in the campus.

ANTI-RAGGING CELL

The Disability Cell of the college has made pioneering efforts to use the latest technology in order to help disabled students overcome all limitations.

COUNSELLING CELL

In keeping with the need of the times, a counselling cell functions at the college where students get to discuss their personal or academic concern with trained, qualified counsellors. This facility functions twice in a week which is meant to develop problem solving and analytical abilities in our students.

ELECTORAL LITERACY CELL (ELC)

ELC is a platform to engage the students through interesting activities and hands-on experience to sensitise them on their electoral rights and familiarise them with the electoral process of registration and voting. ELCs are also present in colleges and rural communities.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL (GRC)

The Grievance Redressal Cell (GRC) aims to look into the complaints lodged by any student and redress it as per requirement. The students can state their grievance regarding any academic and non-academic matter within the campus through the online and grievance/suggestion box. The cell motivates and promotes scientific temper among the students and provides a platform to incubate their innovative ideas into commercially viable products.

INNOVATION AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT CENTRES (IEDC)

The Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Centres (IEDC) are platforms set up in Engineering, Management, Arts & Science Colleges, Medical Institutions, Polytechnics and Universities with an aim to provide students with an opportunity to experiment and innovate. Kerala Startup Mission has set up IEDCs in 341 institutions across the State which provide avenues for creative students to learn, collaborate and transform their innovative ideas into prototypes of viable products and services. Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Centre (IEDC) is a flagship initiative of Kerala Startup Mission to promote innovation and entrepreneurship among the student and academic fraternity in the educational institutions in the State of Kerala and considered as an umbrella programme that would play an instrumental role in fostering innovation culture in Academic institutions.

INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHT (IPR) CELL

IPR Cell has been formed in our college to provide knowledge by coordinating and conducting activities related to the Intellectual Property Rights in the Institution and also to create awareness among the stakeholders.

INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE (ICC)

The committee has duly constituted in accordance with the instructions of the National Commission for Women and guidelines issued in the implementation of the directives of the Honourable Supreme court of India on the subject of Sexual Harassment of Women in the workplace. The committee looks into various types of complaints on the part of girl students, and female staff and suggests various procedures for the prevention of sexual harassment and continually monitors the well-being of girl students inside and outside the campus.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION CELL

There will be periodic test papers and internal examinations in each semester. Progress cards will be issued to the parents in the class wise PTA meeting convened by the class tutor after the internal examinations. No student is permitted to abstain herself from these examinations. Students not having sufficient Attendance, Progress and Conduct (APC) cannot write university examination as per University rules.

MEDIA RELATIONS CELL

The Media and Public Relations Cell in the college is responsible for press-coverage and all media related activities. The Media Relations Cell looks after all communication and publications - internal & external and also serves as the official spokesperson of the institute. The role of this cell is to manage relations with external stakeholders through several media relation activities. It accomplishes this through engagement with the print media and by facilitating institute's online presence across various platforms. This cell also manages internal communication by reporting events, happenings and achievements to the administration, faculty and student community.

MINORITY CELL

The aim of the Minority Cell is to empower the minority communities in the College and assist them in their

curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. The Cell has been set up to help students from minority communities achieve holistic development.

OBC CELL

OBC cell in the college was established with the purpose of empowering the OBC communities in the region. The College takes special interest in facilitating financial support to students from these communities from government agencies and other sources. The cell is always engaged to solve the various problems of OBC students.

RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT CELL

Research and Development Cell was established in the college to inculcate research and innovative skills among faculty and students. R&D Cell provides a platform for creativity and innovation to flourish young minds in Institute. Innovative breakthroughs will happen only because of meticulous efforts of R&D.

SC/ST CELL

The Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribes (ST) Cell in the college promotes the special interests of students in the reserved category. It also provides special inputs in areas where the students experience difficulties.

SCHOLARSHIP CELL

Scholarship Cell has been established to channelize maximum scholarships to the students of the college. It aims to extend a helping hand to the student community of the college by which they will get to know various agencies that provide various scholarships and free ships. The scholarship cell has an Institutional Nodal Officer from the teaching staff and an office staff to assist and support the students in applying for various scholarships from Government and Non-Governmental agencies. The Nodal Officer and the office staff together discharge the verification and approval of the scholarships following all the due procedures. Another office staff of the college is in charge of the e-grants who meticulously work to bring in maximum number of e-grants from the Govt. to the deserving students.

The scholarship cell of the college organizes orientation sessions to the first-year students as a part of the Bridge Course of the fresher's and a separate orientation programme for the seniors to ease the renewal process of various scholarships. The cell regularly updates all the notifications of scholarships. WhatsApp groups are created and the student queries on scholarships in the groups are answered by the scholarship cell.

The cell liaises with various industrial establishments, corporate houses etc. which conduct campus interviews and select graduate and post-graduate students from all disciplines. The cell is assisted by a committee comprising representatives of students from the under-graduate and post-graduate streams.

Our college is one of the selected colleges by Kerala State Women Development Corporation (KSWDC) for establishing Women Cell. We have been conducting varieties of activities like Open forum, Premarital counselling, women awareness camps, community awareness sessions, film screening etc. Selected students receive financial assistance from Women Cell. With a vision to bring women to the frontline of societal development as envisaged by KSWDC, Women Cell of the college functions as one of the change agents in the institution by instilling confidence in the female student community. Student run bicycle training, Campus Radio, Uniform Bank etc are a few of the best practices of the cell helping the students to overcome the constraints related with mobility expression and money.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

CALICUT UNIVERSITY SOCIAL SERVICE PROGRAMME (CUSSP)

All students shall undergo a minimum of 42 days of social service work during the course (3 years) for awarding their degree. The aim is to arouse the social conscience among the student community and to inculcate a service mentality and prepare them to be useful to the society. There is an implementation committee in the college with a coordinator and class tutors who are in charge of executing and monitoring the programme.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

A unit of NCC has been functioning in this college since 2005. The unit is functioning under 9 Kerala Girls Battalion NCC Calicut. The strength of our unit is 106. The Motto of NCC is 'Unity and Discipline'. Main objectives of NCC are to develop qualities of character, courage, comradeship, discipline, leadership, secular outlook, spirit of adventure and the ideals of selfless service among youth to make them useful citizen.

Academic Incentives for NCC Cadets

Weightage of Mark: Degree =15 marks, P.G = 5 marks. 'A', 'B', 'C' Certificate holders are eligible for Additional weightage marks 3, 5, & 5 respectively. Grace Marks (Calicut University): 'B' Certificate 2%, TSC cadets 6%, 'C' certificate 4%, RD cadets 7%. Govt. of Kerala PSC reference in uniformed services of State. Bonus Mark- 'A' certificate -02, 'B' certificate -03, 'C' certificate 05.

Reservation of Post: For the PG programme one seat each to eligible cadets for each course of arts, commerce, MBA and LLB at Cochin University.

Scholarships: Rs.6000/- per year to 760 cadets. Best cadets Rs. 3500/- each, Second best cadet Rs. 2500/- each. Sahara Scholarships: SW Rs.12000/- each. Professional courses Rs. 30000/- (eligibility criteria-the candidate should have 80% attendance in NCC, 65 % mark in Science, 60% in Commerce, 55% in Arts stream in XII, should have completed at least 1 year of NCC in SW).

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The main objective of NSS is to create a spirit of service among students to the fellow being and to the society. It also aims at the personality development of students by interaction and participation in various social and cultural activities. Every student completing 240 hours of social work and attending one special camp will be eligible for a certificate issued by University, which fetches 5 marks weightage for higher study. There are two units of N.S.S (Unit No. 171 and Unit No. 8) in the college each having an enrolment strength of 100.

SWAYAM-NPTEL LOCAL CHAPTER

Our college is a local chapter of National Programme on Technology Enhanced Learning (NPTEL), a project by IITs, funded by the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) that provides e-learning through online Web and Video courses in Engineering, Sciences, Technology, Management and Humanities. NPTEL is one of the national Co-ordinators of MHRD's prestigious Study Webs of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds (SWAYAM) programme; the Massive Online Open Course (MOOC) initiative by Indian Academia. All courses offered by NPTEL are part of SWAYAM.
